COMMAND TRAINING SERIES

The *Command Training Series* is intended as a conceptual continuum of management and leadership education for criminal justice professionals. The courses have been designed to provide supervisory and management personnel with knowledge and skills appropriate to their role responsibility in modern criminal justice agencies.

COMMAND TRAINING SERIES:

First Line Supervisor Course

The two week long *Command Training Series: First Line Supervisor Course* provides sworn public-safety professionals with contemporary, relevant concepts of management and leadership appropriate to the role responsibilities of first-line supervisors in a modern criminal justice agency. Attendees will examine topics including: Leadership, Management & Transitions for the First Line Supervisor; Leadership & Communication Styles; Data Analysis; Problem Solving & Planning; Crisis & Situational Leadership; Ethical Decision Making; and Discipline, Labor Relations & Conflict Management.

COMMAND TRAINING SERIES:

Mid-Management Course

The two week long *Command Training Series: Mid-Management Course*, appropriate to people typically holding the rank of lieutenant, provides sworn public-safety professionals with contemporary, relevant concepts of management and leadership appropriate to the role responsibilities of the mid-manager in a modern criminal justice agency. Attendees will examine topics including: Emotional Intelligence, Organizational Culture & Change Management; Internal & External Communications; Project Management; Leadership; Understanding the Budgeting Process; and Contemporary & Critical Issues.

COMMAND TRAINING SERIES:

Executive Development Course

The *Command Training Series: Executive Development Course* provides sworn public-safety professionals with contemporary, relevant concepts of management and leadership appropriate to the role responsibilities of the executive level in a modern criminal justice agency. The course is appropriate for people typically holding the rank of captain, major, deputy-chief, and chief. This is a hybrid course, which includes web-based as well as classroom instruction over a seven-week time frame, with six total days in the classroom. Attendees will examine topics including: Organizational Culture & Change Management, Strategic Communications; Reflective Leadership; Strategic Thinking & Planning; Managing the External Dimension of Decision Making; Research & Policy Development; Budgeting; Managing the Political Environment; Labor-Management Relations; and Legal Issues for Risk Management.

FIELD TRAINING & EVALUATION PROGRAM SERIES

FIELD TRAINING & EVALUATION PROGRAM:

FTO Course

The one week long *Field Training & Evaluation Program – FTO Course* is designed to provide formal training and practical information for personnel who will become field training officers in their police department. The seminar, through reference to the “San Jose Model”, will consider specific teaching methods applicable to adult learners, performance evaluations using standardized rating procedures, remedial-training techniques, and legal issues in recruit training; as well as ethics, leadership, communication, evaluation, retention and dismissal.

FIELD TRAINING & EVALUATION PROGRAM:

Coordinator Course

The *Field Training & Evaluation Program – Coordinator Course* is a three-day seminar designed to provide practical information for police administrators and mid-level managers responsible for the supervision and

management of a Field Training & Evaluation Program. Based on the “San Jose Model,” topics will include: Overview of the Field Training and Evaluation Program; Field Training Officer selection, retention, and evaluation; establishing and maintaining the “Rook Book”; remediation–identification and facilitation; trouble shooting your FTO Program; ethics and liability issues.
